CHINA MEDIA AUSTRALIA EXOTIC SEAS

Nautical Book



Bruce Maxwell, who used to produce the Southeast Asian edition of Asian Boating magazine, now Asia-Pacific Boating, in Kuala Lumpur, has published a 700+ page memoir, full of nautical anecdotes, called China Media Australia Exotic Seas: A Recent History Of Us.

A regular at Royal Selangor Yacht in the 70s, 80s, 90s and Nauties, he also played a part in starting the King's Cup in Phuket and the island-

hopping Raja Muda Regatta, which with the Singapore Straits Regatta led to the popular regional yacht racing circuit. There was also a well-attended youth sailing event held at Tioman Island and backed by ASEAN navies.

Maxwell devotes two chapters to stories about the South China Sea, which he crossed 100 times in yacht races, on delivery voyages and fishing. For five years he ran the South China Sea Sport Fishing Tournament at Pratas Reef or Dongsha, 165 nm SE of Hong Kong on the China Coast, where he based too. A potted history of the South China Sea is included.

As a sailing buddy of the then Raja Muda, Tengku Idris Shah, he was invited to his Coronation as Sultan of Selangor, and there are many other cameo accounts, such as an Imperial Poona Yacht Club dinner aboard the Royal Yacht *Britannia*, with the Duke of Edinburgh presiding.

ANNEX BUILDING STATUS



Upon being elected, the Current Committee has made it a priority to resolve issues relating to the Annex building.

Audited accounts show that the Annex has cost us in the region of RM1.6 mil. This includes the concrete deck around the pool area.

The cost of consultants and application for building plan approval had been in the region of RM100,000.00 thus far.

A senior independent Structural & Geotechnical Engineer (Ir Krishnan Raman) of R&A Geotechnics had been appointed to advice the Committee on steps to be taken and provide engineering solutions.

The Engineers studied the construction documents available and inspected the building. It was noted that settlement cracks were expanding in numerus areas. Ir Krishnan proposed a ground/soil investigation to enable him to better understand the conditions and to determine the condition of the existing piles.

The comprehensive soil investigation has now been completed and the findings are that the Annex is sitting on "very soft marine clay" (which is approximately 27 meters deep). The poor soil condition and insufficient pile foundation of the Annex are the cause of the settlement cracks in and surrounding the building.

The Engineers has confirmed that the Superstructure is not in imminent danger of collapse and it is possible to rectify and save the building by undertaking appropriate foundation strengthening followed by building repair works.

A: We have now completed the following:

- i. Soil Investigation
- ii. Physical inspection, Building Survey & Crack Mapping.

B. Currently ongoing (to be completed by February 2025):

- i. Detailed engineering study, data evaluation, structural modeling & modeling load -frame analysis.
- ii. Building distortion simulation to field condition of building & stress distribution.
- iii. Detailed remedial design of foundation underpinning & structural repair.
- iv. Engineering Alternative solutions.

- v. Preparation of drawings, specification & Bill of Quantities
- vi. Appointment of M&E Consultants, ID & Architects.

C. Final Steps to be taken (full process to be completed within 12 months of commencement):

- i. Call for Tender for options on remedial works to Annex Building (to obtain quotations for all options)
- ii. Independent cost benefit analysis to consider all options;
- ii. Call for RSYC EGM for members mandate on best option and appointment of Contractors;
- iii. Award & Implementation of Contractors (upon EGM approval);
- iv. Completion & Certificate of Completion & Compliance.

The Committee is motivated to resolve all issues pertaining to the Annex transparently and will call for town hall sessions with members if required and provide full disclosure in relation to ongoing reports and work.




PONTOON RENOVATION

Commodore Rama designed pontoon joiners of varying sizes and lengths for the club. The shafts were fabricated by Vermech Engineering Sdn Bhd, while the 26 mm galvanized wire rope was supplied by Goforth. This project was proposed during the 6th committee meeting and received approval.

A stress test was conducted on the joiner, during which the wire cable failed under a stress load of 541.1 kN. Goforth Corporation Sdn Bhd provided the corresponding mill test certificate.

The project includes two variations of pontoon joiners, with diameters of 50 mm and 40 mm. Each pontoon is secured between rubber dampers measuring 100 mm in thickness on both ends, custom-made by Tagwin Engineering Sdn Bhd. The estimated total cost for repairing the pontoon is approximately RM 80,000. This includes the specialized nuts (Brilliant Bolts and Nuts Sdn Bhd), washer plates and galvanized cleats manufactured by VG Offshore Sdn Bhd.
